What You Will Do

Essential functions of the job include, but are not limited to:

- Builds and maintains strategic partnerships with community organizations to coordinate services and promote public health goals.
- Identifies and maintains a list of referral sources for assigned program(s) and disseminates as appropriate.
- Provides general technical assistance and consultation to schools, health professionals and organizations, co-workers, community organizations, and the general public on designated public health service(s) or program(s).
- Works with individuals and/or entities internally and externally to ensure compliance with federal, state and/or local mandates affecting assigned program(s).
- Assists with developing program goals, objectives, and guidelines necessary for effective implementation of services to target populations.

- Assists with evaluating program effectiveness and developing plans for increasing effectiveness in the future.
- Performs community outreach activities to raise awareness and ensures compliance of assigned program(s).
- Performs health assessments and screenings by interview and/or physical examination.
- Develops plans of care to achieve expected outcome(s) by identifying problems, identifying needed resources and works with client and/or client medical providers to develop a timetable for reaching goals.
- Provides client education in an individual or group setting.
- Documents services and activities using appropriate workflows.
- Participates in the educational experiences of nursing students, serving as a preceptor and mentor.
- Provides case management activities, coordination, and implementation of designated public health service(s) or program(s) as assigned.

What Qualifications You Need

- Associate's degree or diploma from an accredited college, university or school of nursing plus 2 years of full-time experience as an RN.
- BSN from an accredited college or university.
- The equivalent combination of experience and education sufficient to successfully perform the essential functions of the job.

Certifications:

- Must attain CPR certification prior to appointment date and maintain throughout incumbency.
- Must attain and maintain any required certification(s) for assigned programs.

License: Must attain license to work as an RN in Kentucky prior to appointment date and maintain throughout incumbency.

Other: Must possess a valid, active driver's license and reliable transportation.

Knowledge of:

- Federal, state, and local mandates pertaining to assigned program(s).
- Key stakeholders and medical providers in the community.
- Nursing theory, public health nursing, and standard public health nursing protocols.
- Principles and methods for teaching and instruction designed to affect behavior modification.
- Resources for assigned programs.
- Laws, regulations, best practices, and health department policies, procedures, technology, and equipment pertaining to assigned duties.

- Interact with key stakeholders to affect the enforcement of mandates pertaining to assigned program(s).
- Assess health needs and recommend the most appropriate intervention(s).
- Use and generally maintain standard medical and nursing equipment, instruments, and supplies.

- Work both independently and as part of a team.
- Maximize and appropriately use resources.
- Provide excellent customer service.
- Perform with a high degree of accuracy and attention to detail.
- Understand and follow written and oral instruction.
